# An update on Helping Seniors of Brevard

ear friends,

This is a general update on our progress to date and how you can join us in identifying and addressing items of interest to seniors and those who care for them.

For more information, you might want to refer to previous articles, postings on our website at www.helpingseniorsofbrevard.org and other available resources.

Helping Seniors has identified a major need in Brevard for a county aging plan.

In 2012, the Brevard Commission on Aging conducted a workshop that resulted in a 140-page compilation of pictures and statistics, but no plan. To make use of these valuable statistics, Helping Seniors has formed a task force of 43 people who will advocate for seniors and develop an aging plan for Brevard County.

We have held four meetings, selected a template for the plan and will eventually present our work to the Brevard County Commission.

One of our major tasks is to develop an endowment to help seniors meet needs they can't afford or resolve through other nonprofit agencies.

For example, we heard of a couple who was living on \$796 a month and \$350 in food stamps. The husband could not eat because his dentures did not fit nor did he have the money to replace them.

Our Board of Directors decided to use endowment funds to pay for his dentures. Now the man is able to eat. A small use of funds, but very necessary, as only one other resource would have possibly paid for the dentures.

At this point, our endowment is in its infant stages and only capable of meeting small needs on a limited basis, but we will grow and have already started receiving donations.

Why is this important? Well, current nonprofit and government organizations do not have the resources to remedy such situations in a timely manner.

The lack of a county aging plan with identified needs and the funding to pay for such needs is important.

Did you know the county builds its budget with no knowledge of the economic impact seniors have on Brevard? The Commission on Aging doesn't know its economic impact either, but 22 percent of Brevard's population is older than 65.

In 2002, Brevard County was identified as an elder-friendly county. When seniors receive no direct budget line item, yet children receive 44.6 percent of the tax dollar, it becomes difficult to say we are an elder-friendly community.

Yes, development of an aging plan will require new funding or some shifting of current assets so that

It is time for the county commissioners to require a new look at what we are getting for our buck!


