

New prescriptions law a pain for many seniors

Dear Friends,
 Since my recent article on opioids, we have received numerous calls to our office from seniors having trouble obtaining their pain medication subsequent to the passage of Florida House Bill 21. Many callers suffer from fibromyalgia, a syndrome that causes widespread musculoskeletal pain. These callers noted the absence of support groups for those diagnosed with fibromyalgia.

I was diagnosed with fibromyalgia many years ago and know that the pain associated with it is often unbearable. You can search Florida Today and www.Helpingseniorsofbrevard.org to review the articles I have written on back pain and what it can do to other parts and functions of the body. Since I am not a doctor, I can only offer my opinion based on what we lay people call "on the job training," and here it might be called "personal pain."

Regardless of the name attached, the

resultant pain can be extremely severe. Treatment is difficult to prescribe and most often administered on a trial and error basis. I admire doctors who treat this disease because the honest ones will tell you they do not know what it is or what causes it. They do know those who have been diagnosed with fibromyalgia have painful days ahead.

My efforts to self-treat were more effective before I had my stroke and limited gym days. To try to relieve different pains associated with the disease, I have endured pain management, therapy, back operations, massages, and burning of nerve endings. Now I am on a firmly controlled diet with no

gluten, sugar, sodas, or alcohol, and scarce red meat. The goal is to eat an abundance of fresh fruits and vegetables and ingest shakes and other vegetable capsules to eliminate inflammation markers. To date I have experienced no change.

By change I mean any improvement in rising from a sitting to standing position without extreme pain, same for walking, even with my rollator, which I would not walk without due to poor balance. My posture has become stooped, something of which I am not proud. I know I have problems, but also know there are millions out there just like me.

Bringing it closer to home I know many experience the same difficulty naming their disease and coping with it. The passage of HB 21 governing the use of opioids combined with how little we know about the disease make it long overdue to develop a fibromyalgia support group. Let's join forces to develop a catalogue of problems associated with

the disease and possible treatments - exercise, medication, pain management, and many others.

The support group will be held at the Helping Seniors office in the Unity of Melbourne building, 2401 N. Harbor City Boulevard, where we can seat about 120 people. While we will start small, I believe the group will grow since there are so many who cope daily with the painful symptoms of fibromyalgia.
