Helping Seniors has a caring and honest Board of Directors, which we plan to enlarge in order to reach the entire community. Can an Endowment solve all problems? No, it can not. But wisely used, it can provide breathing room to many in need so that long term solutions can be put in place.

Am I dreaming to believe that an Elder Endowment is possible? Not at all. In 2001 when I retired from the Brevard Alzheimer's Foundation, I left them with a \$2M endowment. So I know our community can raise money to assist others. It

takes a plan, leadership, and people willing to support a cause they believe is wisely and honestly managed to serve others.

Never before has the need been so great to do what I describe here. With the Brevard County Commissioners' act to defund local nonprofits and the unwillingness of bigger nonprofits to fund new, smaller ones, we will encounter more unmet needs.

For five months I have answered the phones for Helping Seniors and listened to pleas for help. Recently a 63 year old woman called. Put yourself in her shoes you cannot walk and are dependent on an electric scooter for mobility. You live on disability and just received notice that in one month you will be evicted from your apartment. You know that the waiting lists for affordable housing in Brevard County are one to two years. That means living in your car (if you have one), or sleeping in the woods. Now imagine there is an Endowment that can temporarily pay for your hotel costs while you find living accommodations. What a blessing!

There are many stories to tell. While I

Many new needs will emerge as we encounter larger numbers of seniors living on fixed incomes. The lack of family support and increased living costs make the establishment of an Elder Endowment more important to a stable continuum of care and the ability to age with dignity. What I am proposing can be accomplished, but it will take your support. What if for one year, 1,000 readers a month send me a check for \$50? What if we could convince our Commissioners to return a small part of what seniors give to the General Fund to build an Endowment? Think about my words and determine your ability to be part of the solution, not the problem.
