The Dental Staff Member

Lee Sheldon, DMD

I love my staff. So why would that make any difference to you? Let's count the reasons.

1. If I love my staff, chances are that they like being in the office too. Do you think a happy staff member can impact your treatment?
2. Why would I love my staff?
 - a. Loyalty--Staff members who last a long time in my office are trusted people. Why would they last so long if they weren't? If your doctor trusts them, how do you feel it affects you?
 - b. Training--The trained staff member makes the doctor's job easier by doing some of the reversible tasks that the doctor may otherwise have to do. That means your doctor is more relaxed because he or she doesn't have to do "everything." (Don't think that a doctor has to do all the work. My assistants are better at making temporaries than I am.) That staff member also has more job satisfaction because her level of contribution is greater.
 - c. Competence--Staff members receive rewards for increased abilities and competence. Those that reach the top are competent not only in their own fields but in other areas of the office as well.
 - d. Attitude--We monitor the tone levels of our staff. High toned people are enthusiastic, relaxing, and reassuring. Add that to the competence in (b.) above, and you have perfect staff member.
3. What should you look for? A key is a smile on the face of the staff member. Add that to communications skills and confidence and chances are you have a good staff member. A good dentist respects his or her staff. That staff member will be your advocate at the office, will have the ability and the permission to do whatever is necessary to make you happy.

The purpose of this letter is to seek your support in helping us develop senior service providers and finding advertisers.

You know this is a bargain, so I ask you to become an ambassador for our directory. If you know of a good company, you can sponsor them or encourage them to advertise in the directory.

Planning for Life's Seasons

For everything there is a season. Unfortunately, one we will all face is often too painful to consider. Eventually a spouse will pass.

I recently had two families call for assistance with very similar situations; the death of a lifelong partner. Both were gentlemen who lost a wife and now faced an empty house alone, and the family lived in other states. The purpose of this article is not to judge the families, but to learn from trials and successes.

A daughter in the first family stuck around for several weeks after. Wanting to make sure Dad would be OK, she had grab bars installed in the bathroom, garage, and porch. She went to the doctor and requested physical therapy due to vertigo, also ensuring strengthening and balance. She brought Seniors Helping Seniors (SHS) in, scheduling three days a week for a few hours not only to help with tasks his wife normally handled, but for companionship as well. As we walked to the car, she told me she knew this was a "make it or break it" time for her dad. So far so good.

The second family needed to leave just two days after the funeral. They realized dad had some memory issues, but he was grieving. It is common for out of town family not to realize that a loved one has dementia because the spouse naturally compensated. Their dad was grieving but combined with cognitive impairment the odds were not in his favor.

The day after everyone left, he drove into the garage door, continued out shopping, then fell in the parking lot. After being bandaged up at the ER he managed to get home (a story in itself) and fell once again. The neighbors notified the kids, the keys were hidden, and SHS was called.


At the assessment we recommended grab bars and physical therapy. A team plan was created between the wife's former caregiver, neighbors, friends, and SHS. Two visits in, Dad was not there. He gave the kids such a hard time that they told him where the keys were. He had driven himself to his appointment. They deemed him non-compliant and canceled services.

We strongly recommended visits for meal preparation, safety, and companionship; he should not be driving until cleared by a doctor. Whether those visits were done by SHS or the other caregiver didn't matter, Dad needs help during this season. Hopefully he gets what he needs.

In both cases I also recommended the Senior Behavioral Wellness program through Health First's Aging Services. It's designed for these situations. Losing someone who has been with you for 69 years must be extremely hard to process. I've had clients go through the program and tell me it "gave them their life back."

We will all face the death of a loved one. When that season comes in my life, what is the plan? Will I be able to "get my life back"? There are resources to help.

The Rule of 100

As we age toward retirement or have recently entered retirement, understanding market risk becomes mandatory. During our working years most of us contributed to a 401K or 403B. We did this with a constant payroll deduction. Each payday the same amount would be contributed to our account. This was done as the market fluctuated up and down.

When the market was trending up, our accounts would normally trend up. However, our contributions would be purchasing less and less investment units because they were rising in price. The reverse would also be true. When the market was trending down, then our accounts would be trending down. However, our contributions would be purchasing more and more investment units because they would be declining in price.

This is a general description of DOLLAR COST AVERAGING. This helped to smooth out volatility. It gave us an edge. When we retire we no longer have that edge. We need to be more concerned about volatility and how it may affect our retirement assets.

A simple way to figure out what percentage of your assets should be invested in the market is the RULE OF 100. Simply subtract your age from the number 100. The remainder is the maximum percentage of your assets that should be at risk in the market.

Example: Someone age 60 would subtract 60 from 100. The remainder of 40 is the maximum percentage of retirement assets that should be invested in the market.

Two important considerations are lack of time to make up for poor decisions about investing and the fact that at retirement, we go from accumulation mode to preservation and distribution mode. These are two different universes.

Understanding Medicare Star Ratings

Medicare is the U.S. government's largest health insurance program, covering U.S. citizens and legal residents 65 and older and people who qualify on the basis of disability or end-stage renal disease (ESRD).

Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) created the Five-Star Quality Rating System to help consumers, their families, and caregivers compare Medicare Advantage and Medicare Prescription Drug Plans more easily based on quality and performance. CMS uses information from member satisfaction surveys, plans, and health care providers to give overall performance star ratings to plans.

A plan can get a rating between 1 and 5 stars. A 5-star rating is considered excellent. Medicare updates these ratings each fall for the following year.

CarePlus is rated an overall 5 out of 5 stars for 2019 by Medicare.

Some of the measurements Medicare considers when determining star ratings are:

- **Chronic condition rating:** Were you able to get the screenings, tests and vaccines you need to help stay healthy? If you have a long-term condition like diabetes, did you get help from the plan to manage it?
- **Part D rating:** Were you prescribed drugs safely and in a way clinically recommended for your condition?
- **Member experience rating:** How satisfied are you with your plan? Did you have a positive experience when you called customer service? How easy is it to use your benefits or see a doctor?
- **Complaint resolution rating:** How often did members have problems with the plan? How much did the plan's performance improved (if at all) over time?
- **Customer service rating:** How responsive is your plan to phone calls and questions?
