Greetings to all,

*Time flies.* The words are often said in conversation with others, especially as we age. I can tell you with certainty that my time seems to be flying by way too fast. Since founding Helping Seniors in 2011, we have identified so many critical and unmet needs, especially affordable housing and transportation.

When I see that expected rent costs will be rising to \$1,500 a month, it is obvious that the homeless cannot afford such prices. To advertise such rents as affordable is a crime. I am no expert as to why a person becomes homeless, but it is a situation that I would not want to experience. Citizen advocacy is great, but the real work of providing a place for the homeless to live and helping them become productive citizens is the responsibility of our Commissioners. As the duly elected governing body of Brevard, they should lead the way in solving a problem that has existed far too long in our county. The county does have the land, there is a way to build a community to house the homeless, and it is a matter that needs addressing now.

Transportation is of equal importance. We receive many calls for next day transportation and explain that is almost impossible. Paying \$40 for a cab ride to a medical appointment is not a problem for many, but when you are living on a \$1,000 a month it can become a problem. A bus system cannot provide door to door transportation, but an on call transportation unit that is part of the bus system and operated for those who would meet income requirements could certainly be developed and managed as part of the total system.

While time does fly, I think we could slow it down enough to accomplish ways to meet the needs expressed above. I think we should try and some three years ago a letter was sent to the Commissioners stating the above problem areas.

## Why Can't I Chew Better?

"You know, I can't chew my food as I used to," my new patient said. "I used to be able to chew anything that I want. Why can't I chew as well now?"

If that's happening to you, here are some of the reasons why you may not be able to chew as well as you used to:

1. You are wearing partial or full dentures. At one time you had teeth that were firmly attached to bone. Now you have teeth that are floating on a ridge. So the foundation for your teeth isn't nearly as firm as it used to be.
2. Your teeth don't meet. And you say, "Of course my teeth meet." Do this experiment. Cut a piece of thin cellophane into a strip that is about ¼ to ½ inch wide and about three inches long. Now place that cellophane between an upper and lower tooth that meet each other and bite down. Try to remove the cellophane. If it stays firmly in place, those two teeth are meeting. If the cellophane slips out easily, then that pair of teeth are not meeting. Do the same exercise for each pair of teeth. If you find that only a few teeth are meeting, that could be a problem.
3. You are missing too many teeth.

Ideally, every tooth should be in contact. You see, we have major groups of muscles that are dedicated to closing our mouths and chewing our food. The force from those muscles is supposed to be taken by 28 teeth, fourteen pairs of teeth (16 pairs if you have wisdom teeth). Let's assume that only seven pairs of teeth are actually meeting. That means that each tooth is taking twice the force that it was designed to take. The teeth that do contact may have too much mechanical stress, resulting in mobility or fractures of these teeth.

So take the test. If you pass, great! If not, find out what can be done.

## Support Family Caregivers

It cannot be a coincidence that November is both Alzheimer's awareness month and family caregiver's month. This year, 5.8 million Americans are living with dementia. While not every care giver is battling dementia, it can be one of the biggest challenges a family caregiver can face.

My introduction to dementia was through my Aunt Peaches. Diagnosed at 49 years old, she had been displaying symptoms for a few years. At her young age, who would have thought about dementia?

Doctor Oz announced this year that his mother has dementia but that he missed many of the clues before her diagnosis. You wonder how a doctor could miss the signs, but it's not surprising. Simply put, it is different when it is YOUR loved one. There is history, we fill in gaps automatically, and there is unintentional denial. The years between symptoms and diagnosis are often painful in hindsight. "I thought she was just giving me a hard time and being manipulative."

If there is any hint of dementia, I highly encourage a trip to a gerontologist. It is key for early intervention. First, it may not be dementia at all. It could be many things; as simple as a vitamin deficiency, thyroid issue, urinary tract infection, or reaction to a medication. In these cases, avoiding a diagnosis would be avoiding a simple cure!

Even with a diagnosis of dementia, research has given us methods to delay the progression and improve quality of life. It also allows the family to access information and support much earlier.

For the same reasons it is difficult to see the early stages of dementia in your loved one, it is also very difficult to be a loved one's full-time caregiver. Ask someone who has been there. It is "easy" at first. Over time the need is greater and greater.

It is difficult to see someone who has always been in charge and care for others now forget how to do simple tasks. There are behavioral challenges. You feel you have let them down if you have someone else help. The caregiver slowly stops tending to their own needs, consumed with the care of their loved one. Often caregivers end up ill themselves.

Early access to support helps prevent burnout. Join a support group. You will be amazed at how much you learn from one another. Have close friends and family help right away. Assign them tasks or days to assist. Have a team. The Brevard Alzheimer's Foundation offer day programs through Joe's Club and a four-hour respite at home. At Seniors Helping Seniors we provide family caregivers much needed relief, so they have the time to take care of themselves.

If you know a family caregiver, reach out to them this month. Bring dinner, offer to sit with their loved one for a few hours, or simply write a note letting them know how wonderful you think they are. They need our support!

## Guardianship Changes Coming

In light of the troubles surrounding a Central Florida professional guardian that have made the news in recent weeks, the Florida Legislature will be taking aim at passing some new laws meant to rein in guardianship practices.

These changes fall into four main categories: (1) the power of a guardian to execute a Do Not Resuscitate Order (DNR); (2) the disclosure of all payments made to the guardian; (3) the disclosure of conflicts of interest; and (4) the ability of professional guardians to petition to have themselves appointed.

The case in Central Florida garnered newsworthy status when it was revealed that the professional guardian had entered into a DNR on behalf of a ward allegedly contrary to the wishes of the hospital's ethics committee and family. The legislature will likely make it mandatory for a professional guardian to seek a court order prior to executing a DNR.

Another sore spot was that the professional guardian allegedly had double-billed the ward and a healthcare provider for the same services. More than likely, the legislature will make it necessary for professional guardians to disclose to the court payments to them for any services connected to the ward.

Though not an allegation in the Central Florida case, professional guardians can expect that they will have to disclose to the court any conflicts of interest they may have with the judge, examining committee, or court appointed attorney for the ward.

Lastly, the legislature will probably put some restrictions on a professional guardian's ability to have themselves appointed to prevent nursing home "trolling".
