Freedom from the Donut Hole

Recently I was sitting in my doctor's office waiting for my annual wellness check. As I looked at the electronic screens discussing various medical topics, one really caught my attention. Did I know that 30% of all medical scripts were not filled? it asked. While I knew people broke pills in half and that some prescriptions were not filled, that 30% statistic really unsettled me.

This made me think again about the donut hole and the overall cost of medicine both to developer and user. I thought about the monthly cost of the few prescription drugs I use, and quickly realized that if I weren't retired military, I would be paying more than \$12,000 annually for them. When I checked back over the years, I saw some of these medicines were quite costly. I am fortunate that my military benefits have covered any medication prescribed to me.

My thoughts then turned to those who do not have military or other paid benefits. There are VA benefits, but those are not always easy to come by. Many private medical benefits have disappeared. With more than 600,000 residents in Brevard (75,000 of whom are VA eligible), there are a whole lot of people with donut hole problems as well as those who simply can not afford the monthly cost of prescription drugs. So what can we do about it?

Those who have insurance plans with prescription drug clauses are most fortu-

nate. But there are other resources: generic drugs can be used at a lower cost, many food and pharmacy chains offer cost saving prescription drug cards, and doctors may have free samples from drug company reps that they can give to patients.

Low income people and senior citizens living on fixed incomes that can not keep pace with the increased costs of daily living are most at risk. Does this mean that we must accept that these medications can not be accessed? Absolutely not – we can and should do better.

Helping Seniors was founded to provide seniors with the information they need to live well and with dignity. People should not have to break pills in half or forego needed medications. Non-availability of medicine is like not having access to affordable housing. We have disabled people in our community who need housing, medicine, and more. It is
