artist pulls from his varied experiences, demonstrated by an extensive, pages-long portfolio beginning in 1972 with No Greater Love, performed at St. Mary's Church. Mr. Bergeron has also written and produced a host of musicals and plays and has operated in the following roles for many more: Production Management, Production Support for Live Stage Presentations, Scenic Design and Fabrication, and he designed and executed various Educational theater workshops at King Center for the Performing Arts and the Naples Philharmonic Center for the Performing Arts, to name a few.

Mr. Bergeron's passion for The Arts is palpable. "Proximity to an art program provides valuable outlets for our young," he exclaimed, "and gives freedom of expression to all, regardless of age or economic status."

Like many nonprofit organizations, Surf-side Playhouse faced many challenges in the face of the pandemic. The future looked grim for the group of performers dependent upon audience participation, ticket sales, and attendance. But Surfside prevailed thanks to generous donations from patrons and government subsidies. In an effort to keep the community engaged, the troupe also staged online readings. This Surfside Original is a hilarious retelling of "whaling, madness, and mayhem," a nautical adventure you'll never forget.

Aside from the amazing productions Surfside happily performs, the organization is equally proud of the enrichment programs they sponsor. Established by Paulette Bethel, Gotta Dance is a one of a kind show focused on adult movement. Under the direction of Eva Knowles, the Youth Program presents three productions featuring students aged 7 - 14. The Fearless Improv Brigade is taught by Mario Busacca and is aimed at introducing improvisational comedy as a tool to help performers better their craft. The ten-week workshop is open to high school aged students and adults of all ages.

Beginning in 2001, the Arlan Ropp Playwright Award is an annual playwriting contest with a \$500 cash prize and an on-stage production of the winning piece. Surfside accepts script submissions from all over Central Florida. The latest winner is Jude Francis Lemoncelli for her play *The Women of Saint Regret*, which premiered at the Surfside Playhouse this past summer. Brevard County writers, heed the call - yours may be the next winning entry!

In addition to shows and cultural enrichment programs, Surfside Playhouse also



brings outside acts from New York and Vegas. They also have a long history of supporting the local surfing community by viewing surf films. To keep the list of activities running, Surfside is always in need of helpful volunteers. Whether it be ushers, carpenters, painters, concessions, crafters, writers, or artists, they eagerly welcome everyone.

"Participating in art, patronizing art, and securing a future for art is a never-ending struggle," said Mr. Bergeron. And although that may be true, the Surfside Playhouse has continued to battle adversity and come out smiling by remaining true to its hometown appeal. "The moment you step foot in our

theater, he continued, "you sense the homelike atmosphere. It's a very real thing...no stress, just comfort." And it's a cheerful comfort they provide, one that lets you sit back and enjoy the show.
