

The Best Time to Plan Your End of Life Wishes is Now.

In Florida, we have two documents that deal with your end of life wishes. The Living Will allows you to put your end-of-life wishes concerning ongoing treatment in writing. The other is the Do Not Resuscitate Order or DNR. This document allows you to indicate if you do not want to be brought back to life if you expire.

For a Living Will, think ventilator or feeding tube. For a Do Not Resuscitate Order, think heart paddles. One covers your wishes while you're alive and the other covers your wishes if you pass.

In a Living Will, you indicate whether you want life sustaining treatment in the event that you are incapacitated and in either a terminal condition, an end stage condition, or a persistent vegetative state. You can also indicate whether you want the artificial administration of food or water if they only prolong the dying process.

There is a standard statutory form that must be signed in the presence of two witnesses, one of whom cannot be a relative. You can obtain a Living Will from an elder or estate planning attorney, your physician, or the hospital.

In a Do Not Resuscitate Order, you indicate whether you want to be brought back to life if you die. You obtain a Do Not Resuscitate Order from your physician. It must be on yellow paper, signed by you and your physician, and prominently displayed.

Small Residential Care Homes, also known as adult family care or group homes, are another wonderful option. These are licensed homes that care for a small number of residents (typically 5–6), offering a cozy, homelike environment with personalized attention.



Skilled Nursing Facilities (SNF), often called nursing homes, provide 24/7 medical oversight and are typically best choice for those with complex or chronic needs that require licensed nursing care.

In-home Care is also a popular option, especially for those who prefer to age in place. From companionship to skilled nursing, many services can now be brought right into the home.

Choosing the right option depends on many factors: current health, future care needs, mobility, cognitive status, social preferences, and finances. As a Certified Senior Advisor (CSA), Certified Dementia Practitioner (CDP), and Speech Language Pathologist (SLP), I understand how to assess these factors and guide families toward choices that support both safety and quality of life.

Physical Therapy Benefits in the Comfort of Home

"Will my Medicare cover that?" It's a question I am asked all the time when approached about physical therapy (PT)benefits. The short answer is yes!

Under Medicare Part B, medically necessary outpatient PT services are paid for. Coverage is obtained once a person meets the Part B deductible, which is \$257. After the deductible is met, a person is responsible for 20% of the Medicare-approved amount. Many times, this 20% is paid under a person's supplemental insurance plan.

Although Medicare does not have a spending limit on physical therapy sessions, once the cost exceeds \$2,410, continued care must meet strict guidelines that indicate medical necessity.

Your physical therapist will create a plan of care to include a recommended number of sessions, treatment types, and goals. Every 10 sessions, the PT will reevaluate the plan until the person meets their treatment goals or no longer benefits from physical therapy.


When PT services exceed \$3,000, Medicare may require a targeted medical review to ensure the cost of the therapy is appropriate with medical necessity as the top priority.

Mobile outpatient PT is an alternative to traditional in-clinic outpatient physical therapy.

If you're in Brevard County, on the second Friday of each month, head to Merritt Square Mall for a unique blend of wellness, movement, and community. AARP Florida and Helping Seniors of Brevard proudly sponsor the local chapter of Walk with a Doc, a national nonprofit that encourages older adults to take "steps" toward healthier living.

Each walk is led by Lydia Rivera, a retired nurse practitioner and lead AARP Florida volunteer. In both Spanish and English, Rivera shares insights on timely wellness topics, answers health questions, and guides participants on a group walk—all for free.

"As a nurse practitioner, my passion has always been rooted in prevention and empowering people to take charge of their health. Leading the Walk with a Doc program in Merritt Island has been one of the most rewarding parts of my career," explains Rivera.

Since launching in January, Merritt Island's Walk with a Doc has grown steadily, now drawing more than 25 walkers each month. According to a recent AARP report, 91% of adults over 50 say walking improves their physical health, and 75% say it boosts their mental wellbeing.

Even more meaningful than the miles are the connections made. "Watching our community come together has been incredible. Every step we take together is a reminder of the power of connection, movement, and health education," Rivera notes.

The Brevard County Housing Market

As we continue through the heat of the Central Florida summer, the Palm Bay housing market is somewhat competitive. Homes in Palm Bay receive 2 offers on average and sell in around 79 days.

We focus on staging the home when selling a home. Staged homes spent 50% less time on the market than homes that were not staged; Staged homes sold for more than 6% above asking price. Homes staged prior to listing sold 79% faster than homes staged after listing.

It is recommended:

- 1. The home must feel new to reflect ease of upkeep.
- 2. When painting, neutralize the home regarding personal taste, so buyers can easily envision the home as it would be outfitted in their taste. An effective way to do this is to paint all rooms in a neutral color.
- 3. Focus on furniture, less is more. An open space makes it easier for the potential buyer to envision using the space to fit their individual lifestyle.
- 4. Emotional Cues: Creating atmosphere is crucial to make the home desirable.
- 5. To Stay or Not to Stay: Pros of moving out showing the home is much more convenient but a vacant home can suggest urgency of selling and that the seller is "motivated to sell quickly" because the empty home is nevertheless an ongoing expense to the seller.




